



Hat Balance Game



Needed Items

- 4-10 hats
- floor marker (chair)
- timer (optional)

<u>Instructions</u>

The student starts with one hat on their head. They walk across the room to the "tree", go around the "tree" and walk back across the original place. Each time the student gets back to the starting line, they can add another hat to their head. Repeat, until student can't balance anymore hats. To make the came more difficult, you can add a timer.

Students pair up (or if only one student, pair with parent or teacher) and face each other, as if looking into a mirror. Student #1 moves slowly while student #2 attempts to copy. Switch back and forth so both get a turn to lead/copy.
